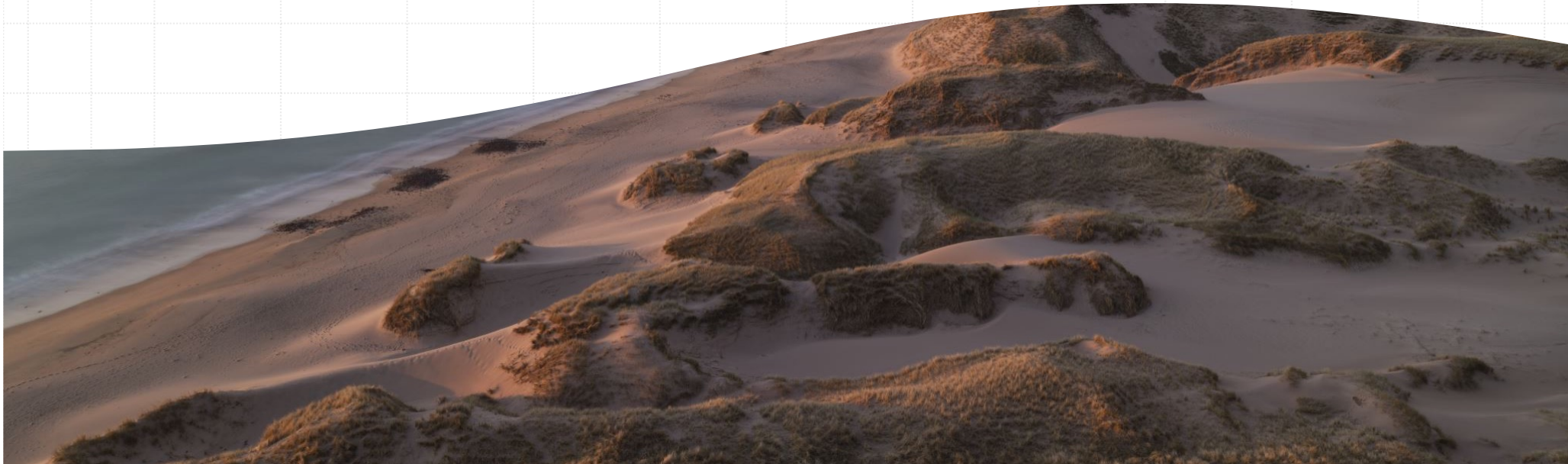

Potential enrollment strategies



Ongoing support for CC/HS dual enrollment – supported with K12 SWP, CTE courses are the “low hanging fruit” of dual enrollment



Using LAEP (Learning Aligned Employment Program) funds to subsidize student internships and claim CWE (Cooperative Work Experience) FTEs – supported by Career Centers and Employer Engagement



Adult Pathways – supported by noncredit, adult education, etc.

Alignment with system Chancellor's goals

- The system chancellor has outlined the following three goals for her first year:
 - Dual enrollment – every high school student will have the opportunity to earn 12 college units by graduation. The SCCRC overall has made great progress in this area.
 - Climate change – The Offshore Wind Industry and Hydrogen production are two employment sectors expected to expand in our region in the next few years.
 - AB 1705 Implementation – This will be addressed at each campus and works in tandem with expanding dual enrollment opportunities.



K16 Collaborative Update

- Currently in planning phase and developing an \$18.1 million dollar implementation grant for the six county region.
- Goal is to streamline equitable pathways from high school to postsecondary education and into the workforce.
- Proposal due October 3rd.

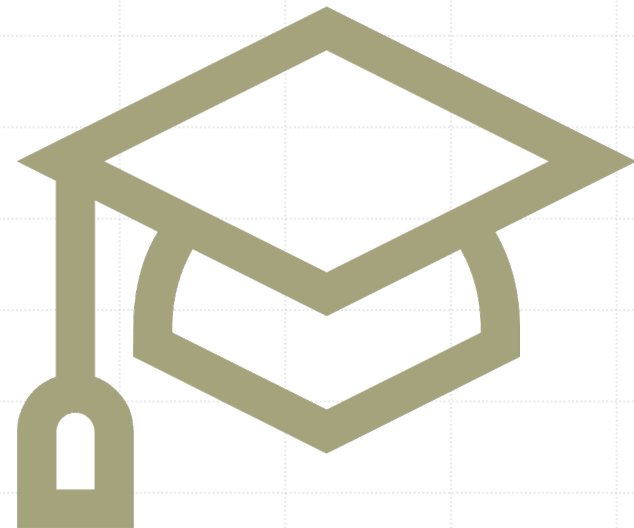
K16 Continued

- Requirements:
 - Establish a steering committee that includes 25% employers
 - Participate in the Cradle to Career Data System
 - Address 4 of 7 recovery with equity strategies (pending)
 - Improve staff diversity
 - Cultivate an inclusive, engaging and equity oriented learning environment
 - Retain students through inclusive support
 - Provide high touch, high-tech advising
 - Support college preparation and early credit
 - Subsidize internet access
 - Improve college affordability
 - Address at least 2 occupational pathways – STEM Education, Healthcare, Engineering selected



Central Coast K16 Mission/Vision

- North Star
 - Create a Central Coast Region in which historically marginalized students achieve their goals within K-16 education and local industry, and secure high-wage, high impact careers that advance opportunities for upward mobility.
- Near Star
 - The Collaborative will co-design with all educational partners an equitable, aligned and effective educational system across the region by prioritizing systemic changes that benefit economically disadvantaged Latina/o/x students. Building on community strengths, assets and aspirations, we will ensure fair representation of community and student voice. In the next three years, using data-informed practices, the Collaborative will eliminate systemic inequities and advance equity of outcomes for our region's economically disadvantaged Latina/o/x students.
- The governance structure was also recently approved and includes provisions for subregional leadership.
