



Program Recommendations

Community Colleges in California need to submit for program recommendation for revised certificate programs. This is required by Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations (CCR), which governs curriculum and instruction in the California Community Colleges system.

- The specific regulations that apply to revised certificate programs are CCR §§ 55131-55134. These regulations require colleges to submit a program proposal that includes the following information:
- A description of the program's goals and objectives
- A list of the program's courses and their prerequisites
- A description of the program's faculty and facilities
- A plan for evaluating the program's effectiveness
