CONGRATULATIONS TO CUESTA COLLEGE AND VENTURA COLLEGE

- Twelve community colleges, including Cuesta College and Ventura College, have been selected to participate in the associate degree for nursing demonstration project led by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office.
- The pilot program will involve a multifaceted set of key strategies designed to expand the capacities of associate degree nursing programs across all community colleges, including the integration of simulation labs to enhance hands-on learning experiences.
 - Strategic scheduling processes to accommodate diverse student needs, including accelerated and fast-track programs, year-round schedules and admission timelines, and evening cohorts.
 - Increase in night rotations to provide flexible clinical experiences.
 - Increase in hospital-based faculty members to expand program capacity and enrich the educational experience for students.
