Lobbyist Austen Webster told the committee that this was the first year in a two-year cycle. That means that committees are being realigned and that the education committees in both the Assembly and the Senate will have new members.

The deadline for new legislation is coming up and a flurry of bills is expected.

CCCAOE to advocate in WDC
