Meeting Minutes

9:00 - 9:10 am CCCAOE Presentation

CCCAOE – Mike Hoffman

- Harriet Happel will be leaving the board as communications officer.
- Based on my personal experience, the advocacy committee meets monthly. We hold a Zoom meeting to discuss current events and recommend positions on specific bills.
- One bill was introduced by Assembly Member Fong, which we mentioned earlier. This allows us to utilize regional resources and strengthens the workforce response for work learning. We have someone working at a local security shop and someone working at a local hospital as an intern.

9:10 - 9:20 am Executive Director Update - Holly Nolan Chavez

- Nancy Jo will be leaving her CTE Liaison position at Allan Hancock College. She truly set the standard
 for what a CTE liaison can and should embody, and she is an unwavering advocate for CTE and our
 funding, always ready to participate and be involved in this effort.
- Workforce Partnership/Contract Ed Workgroup
 - This group has been re-named "Workforce Partnerships Workgroup" to more accurately reflect the work being done.
 - The previous group developed a regional <u>Toolkit directory</u> of all contracted, non-credit offerings. All of our regional colleges are accessible to view what's available, and you may send students there or collaborate with those colleges to bring a program to yours.
- Master Plan for Career Education
 - Master plan for career education was released last week; clearly indicates the direction career education is likely to take over the next few years.
 - o This will probably be a topic in the ongoing budget discussions at this time.
 - They're discussing a planning and coordination body involved in the ongoing budget discussions, which emphasizes regional collaboration, skills-based hiring, career pathways, workforce training, and issues of access and affordability (a lot of those things we already do as a regional consortium).
- Employment Training Provider List (ETPL)
 - Lora Jorgensen from the Bay Area spoke at a regional meeting recently about the ETPL funding, which is eligible for employment eligible provider training list. This allows



- companies to get on this list, and they can hire students and get wages subsidized for them, so it's a benefit for our students and employers.
- This advocacy effort aims to simplify this process for both colleges and employers, and we hope to push it forward effectively.
- We appreciate Lora's advocacy efforts because, quite frankly, who wouldn't want to hire students and have their wages subsidized?
- Training is in high demand, so we reduce unemployment, create great opportunities for job seekers, and increase economic mobility—all that we're supposed to be doing anyway.
- However, this represents another funding source, and to be frank, there is a substantial
 amount of money that has been sitting idle with workforce boards, remaining unused for this
 purpose. This situation isn't benefiting anyone.

Through the Bay Area Community College Consortium, we were awarded regional funds to create a series of webinars. It was brought up in the Bay Area that they really didn't have a fair understanding of all the great projects happening throughout the state. They asked us to put together this regional plan to secure the needed funds, which would include a variety of elements; part of the deliverables are the seven seminars. So, we put out a call throughout California for nominations for programs in each region to showcase during the webinars.

• AI Summit- We had to close registration because it was growing so quickly, and we could only accommodate a certain number of people. We had about 225 registrants: 39 students, 38 staff, 66 faculty, 9 administrators, 7 high school partners, and 5 industry partners.

 - We cannot open the Perkins application until every district has certified their headcounts.
 - O Please share this information with your districts. The AI Fellows program is set to launch in April, likely towards the end of April or in early May. The fellows will work alongside the digital center team and assist in various initiatives related to economic and workforce

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- development. Eight of the fellows will be assigned to the workforce and will represent the various workforce regions with a total of 13 fellows to be hired.
