



Top 25 Community Colleges

- The top 25 performing institutions span seven of the 12 economic regions in California where community and certificate-granting colleges are located. At each of these colleges, the typical student is able to recoup their out-of-pocket costs within six months of earning their credential—a clear indicator of strong economic outcomes. Many of these institutions overwhelmingly serve learners from low-income backgrounds, charge less than \$5,000 annually, and show typical earnings of at least \$10,000 more than a high school graduate within the state. Many others beyond the top 25 also provide strong economic outcomes for learners.



The current grant runs through June 2026.




The new grant application will be released on October 15^{th.}


Beginning in October, the region will host quarterly deans' meetings. 02
