# Growth in Bachelor's Degree Options

- Most regional colleges now have approved community college baccalaureate degree programs (8 approved), with some now having two programs. Two regional colleges (Allan Hancock College and Santa Barbara City College) have developed partnerships with local California State Universities to offer 2+2 baccalaureate degree options on their campuses. These efforts will continue to expand in the region.
