Challenges and To-Do's

- Infrastructure after recession
- Transportation
- Ask WDB Reps about
 - 2-year programs ETPL
 - Get this information to Diane and Luann
 - CC credit for Adult Ed certification and students understand path
- Chancellor's Office metrics (? Jobspeaker)
- Lompoc: small communities may lack infrastructure
- NC not access health services

Round robin report-out of recent activities and best practices

- Cuesta incorporating EL civics, having an embedded counselor, adults with disabilities has been a
 focus not being served with day programs. There is a population of high-functioning autism and
 adults with disabilities. They didn't get response, so they are now slowly working more with
 partnerships in day programs to bring a stronger focus of workplace skills.
- Corlei related that SBCC hired a consultant to do research that included information on the population as to what, where and when courses should be offered. Now they have a career coach to help them with the next step.
- The Lompoc Adult School shared about having a noncredit counselor working just with their population rather than just sending students to the AHC main campus.
- Mike Bastine shared about the Uniquely Abled program.





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- Ventura College has David Mason as liaison who is building the relationship with the one-stop—America's Job Center.
- Mariana shared that Santa Maria is working with the Workforce Resource Center focusing on workplace readiness courses. The WRC is looking at making the classes a requirement for their clients. They are working on getting more courses on the EPL list.
- Moorpark College is expanding career week to the middle schools in partnership with local adult ed schools. David added that he's listening for more VESL information. They do have a noncredit program in Rad Tech with a 3rd party vendor. He has developed an autism technician program 54 clock hours including 14 hours of clinical.
- Ventura College doesn't have one dean assigned to noncredit—spread over several areas. They have developed a certificate of completion for "cognitively diverse" learners. David shared that Moorpark.

Brainstorm and discussion regarding elements that should be included in the SCCRC regional plan.


- The Ventura District will create a dashboard of outcomes from having the new position of the Adult Ed liaison.
- The Uniquely Abled program could be run as noncredit if there were no restrictions on class size.
- There was discussion about the need to capture "rich data" and also data that reflects on the SWP metrics.
- Continue to have best practices as part of our twice yearly Adult Ed meetings.
