- **Serving adult learners** working adults in communities who are looking to increase skills and education to advance careers and wage gains. Many are underrepresented and disadvantaged populations.
- **Recovery with Equity** new RFAs and funding opportunities will focus on the regions, communities, and groups that traditionally have been underrepresented and underinvested. Example of regions include the Central Valley, Inland Empire, and the North and Far North.
- 21st Century Digital skills and literacy Foundation digital skills is an inherent aspect of 21st century education, being able to understand and use technology, including emerging ones. Digital literacy plays a vital role in defining a student's ability to succeed both in school and throughout their lives, and in navigating the future of work.
- Fourth Sector and Social Enterprises incorporating into WEDD initiatives focused on supporting entrepreneurship and employer engagement strategies, to support recovery with equity.
