### 9:10 - 9:50 a.m. **Brief Report Outs**

### a. Regional Chairs/SWP Fiscal Agents

i. There is advocacy statewide for restoring the 30-month spending window, especially for Round 5

### California Community College Association for Occupational Education (CCCAOE)

- i. Spring 2022 Conference April 6-8, 2022
- ii. Regional Meeting is now **Weds April 6<sup>th</sup> at 10am**. CCCAOE has OWL technology for virtual attendees. CCCAO is considering assigning an OWL to each Regional Vice President (ours is now, Gary Quire, CTE Faculty Liaison from COC) that could also be used in region.
- iii. Register for this SCCRC Regional Meeting <a href="here">here</a>.
- iv. Harriet Happel encouraged attendance and advocacy—she mentioned the virtual option.
- v. Robert Cabral added that on April 5<sup>th</sup> there is a pre-conference session which is free. He mentioned that one will be a session on cannabis which will include a tour (for members only). There will also be a session on apprenticeships. Target Corp session on supply chain logistics.
- vi. Harriet mentioned sub-committees—advocacy committee as well as a membership committee.

### c. Center of Excellence—Adele was not present

- i. Harriet reported that the Perkins Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment (CLNA) employer engagement survey is open until March 15<sup>th</sup>. Some preliminary data has been released and they are talking with Job Developers to encourage more employer participation.
- ii. Harriet will email the deans tomorrow. She worked with a media/entertainment arts advisory group at COC yesterday and asked 5 questions from the survey. She will send the questions to the deans and grant writers and recommends that they use the same process.
- iii. Robert shared that the VCCCD colleges will do a listening session mid-March. Attendees to their Career Week must take the survey and will have a focus group from 8:30 to 10 on Tuesday, March 15<sup>th</sup>.

### d. Joint Special Population Advisory Committee (JSPAC)—no report

### e. Contract Education Workgroup—

- i. Dave Teasdale displayed the splash page for the contract ed page on the SCCRC website. He mentioned that there need to be ongoing resources to sustain the page and keep it up-to-date. It will be a great resource for contract ed professional development. He also stressed the Directory.
- ii. He mentioned that the next survey will go out to assess training needs for incumbent workers. They will exclude anyone who already responded to either the CLNA or the construction surveys. They feel they have a good list of employers for this. By late April-early May there will be a summary released.
  - 1. Question about the survey being sent to anyone who received the CLNA but didn't answer. The employer can't distinguish between the



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- types of surveys. The survey would go out after March  $15^{\rm th}$ . Need to discuss mailing lists.
- 2. Question about which entity will facilitate the survey—Chico State. Important to be clear that the COE office needs to create the outreach message and not Chico State. Employers don't understand that a message from Chico State is actually from our region.
- 3. Question about the number of emails sent to accompany the survey. Dave said that possibly each college could send out the incumbent worker survey (Chico State then collates the results).
- 4. Recommendation from COC that the incumbent worker survey should be vetted by the CEOs. AHC added that she contacted her president's office before sending more CLNA surveys to their local employers and he did have comments and requests for changes. Robert added that CEOs want to make decisions on things that impact their colleges.

  Margaret Lau recommended that Luann send the survey to the Executive Council.
- 5. Recommendation as to have the new Executive Director vet any surveys with the CEO group.
- 6. Recommendation that John Milburn take over chairing the contract ed group when Dave leaves on March 31st.

### 9:50 - 10:10 a.m. Strong Workforce Program Updates

- a. K12 Giselle Bice
  - i. Statewide K12 SWP audit released last week.
  - ii. There will be a debrief with the Regional K12 Review Team and Selection Committee
  - iii. Some Pathway Coordinators will present at the Educating for Careers conference next week.
  - iv. Today there was a webinar about California's new Regional K-16 Education Collaboratives Grant Program. Read more <u>HERE</u>.
  - v. Luann added that the contracts for K12 SWP Round 4 will be going out soon.
  - vi. Laurie Arnold asked that information be communicated more clearly regarding the challenges around reporting elements. VCOE received grants in each round. Guidance from the Chancellor's Office on reporting for Round 1 came out very late. Inconsistent communication and lack of planning and the same issues continue. Requests more professional communication around reporting and LEAs need training regarding access to NOVA. Requests just a link for partners. The K12 SWP is broken. The reporting itself is not generating any meaningful feedback to improve the work. Requests that SCCRC leaders develop solutions. This is disheartening for the downline field. Giselle responded that the group of K14 TAPs have been offering solutions to the Chancellor's Office. Luann reported that there are now monthly calls with K14 TAPs, Regional Chairs, SWP Fiscal Agents with the CO to help unify the communication and improve efforts statewide.

- Seven of the eight colleges represented

#### Marketing

- Considered general marketing materials towards students that can be localized
- Considered for employers a regional approach
- Creating a newsletter or LinkedIn page that has best practice stories from students

### Messaging

- Crafting employer messaging to match what the need is.
- Creating Lunch & Learn for employers to help them get connected with Career Connect
  - Creating a playbook/list of best practice regionally for responding to employers

### **Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs)**

- Standardization ideas for Rejecting of jobs were:
  - No residential homes
  - No mature adult content
  - No gender preferences

### **Current Challenges/Opportunities:**

- Jobs posted are too high level for the community college students
- Getting employers engaged in the investing of the students who are starting a career
- Employers requesting years of experience
- Managing Employers' expectations of listing their jobs

### **Recommendation to Region by Work Group Members:**
