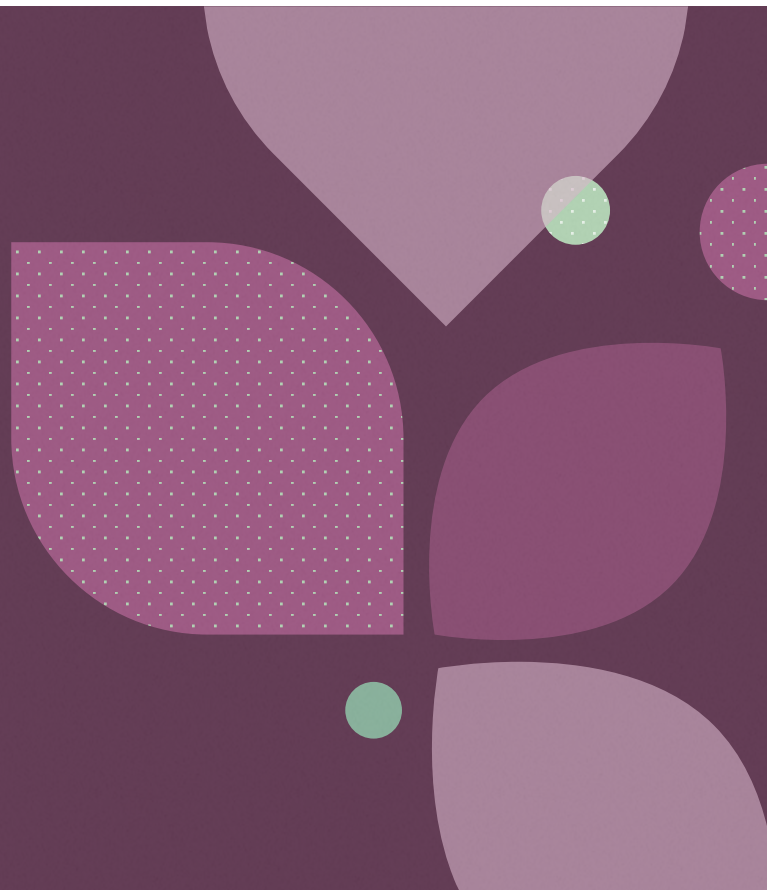

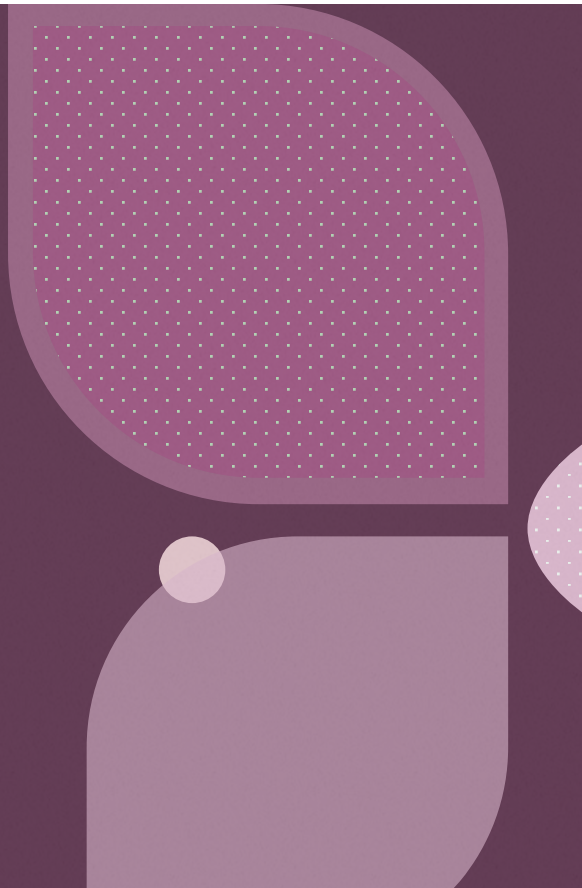

Recent Grant Awards cont.

 - The Central Coast K-16 Education Collaborative supports a data-informed, equity centered planning year. During the planning year, the Collaborative will engage partners across the region, establish a sustainable governance model, make data informed and equity-centered decisions and implementation plans that will enable the Collaborative to address equity gaps along the education to employment pathways for historically marginalized students and communities.

Program Proposal

The Bachelor of Arts in Sustainable Architecture program (BASA) will educate a needed generation of A/E/C industry (Architecture/Engineering/Construction) technicians intimately fluent in application of:

- The California Energy & Green Building Codes.
- Local water conservation and air quality standards.
- The LEED Certification process.
- Resource efficient decarbonized building design and construction administration practices through iterative, data informed methodologies.

Program graduates will be prepared to work alongside other A/E/C industry professionals in a firm or as independent consultants with immediate employment opportunities as Building Energy Modeler/BIM/CAD technicians, LEED AP consultants, and construction management or facility operations technicians for a broad range of employers throughout California

- ▶ In the South Central Coast Region and Los Angeles County, the number of jobs related to Sustainable Architecture are expected to increase for Construction Managers and Architects, Except Landscape and Naval, and remain steady for the other four occupations (Energy Engineers, Energy Auditors, Architectural and Civil Drafters, Sustainability Specialists).
- ▶ Sustainable Architecture is anticipated to experience a medium risk of automation for Architectural and Civil Drafters and Construction and Building Inspectors, and a low risk for the other four related occupations.
- ▶ In 2020, there were 6,055 regional completions in programs related to the occupations identified as aligned with Sustainable Architecture and 8,150 openings, indicating an undersupply.
- ▶ Typical entry-level education is a high school diploma or equivalent for Construction and Building Inspectors, an associate's degree for Architectural and Civil Drafters, and a bachelor's degree for the other four related occupations.
- ▶ In 2021, there were 11,129 total job ads posted that included minimum advertised education requirements. 8,824 of these postings required a bachelor's degree. Employers posting job ads for Sustainable Architecture have frequently sought candidates with a bachelor's degree.

Labor Market Demand Key Findings

To address this unmet regional workforce need, there is a necessity for developing a Bachelor of Arts in Sustainable Architecture degree which will leverage the robust lower division sustainable design and development program currently established at College of the Canyons while expanding the program to offer a much needed applied upper division educational opportunity for students interested in pursuing a career in Sustainable Architecture or related A/E/C fields.

A Pre-Professional Degree

This will not be a 5-year, professional degree in Architecture (ie NAAB Accredited B.Arch) as is offered by Cal Poly Pomona... many Canyons students pursuing architectural licensure in California will continue to apply for transfer admission to B.Arch programs, but will have this pre-professional degree as a fallback option or as an alternate if they would like to pursue a career specifically emphasizing building energy modeling and LEED consulting work.

Our intent is to very carefully delineate and curate the curriculum for this proposed degree so that students could successfully pursue a Master's degree (M.Arch) at an upper division program after earning this degree or transfer to a B.Arch program with upper level standing.
